



Symopsis


Casi Septiembre portrays the life of Alejandra, a young woman who lives yearround with her family in a modest Camping Resort in a coastal town, where her daily life is filled with boredom and temporary seasonal love affairs. During the summer break, the campsite is filled with tourists who bring with them renewed energy, stories and the possibility of brief romances that Alejandra enjoys without commitments. Her world takes an unexpected

turn one night of partying when she meets
Amara, a city girl who radiates confidence
and mystery. As their relationship progresses,
Alejandra begins to confront her past wounds
and to rethink the limits she has imposed
upon herself. This summer, Alejandra faces a
personal transformation that will lead her to
redefine her vision of love and herself.





Biolilmography



Lucía G. Romero was born in Barcelona, Spain in 1999. Due to an early interest in writing and consuming stories, at the age of 18 she obtained a full scholarship to the ESCAC film school from where she graduated with a master's degree specializing in directing.

Cura Sana (2024), her final degree project, accumulated 58 selections and 12 international awards, including the Crystal Bear for best short film in the young audience section of the 74th edition of the Berlinale, the Exaequo Award for Best Femenine Performance at the Malaga Film Festival and the Feroz Cinema Jove 2024 award, as well as a nomination for best short film at the Catalan Film Academy Awards. The film is a personal portrait inspired by her own family story, closely linked to her Cuban roots and full of political and social demands, in line with the first feature film she is developing with a grant from the Spanish Film Academy Screenwriting Residency (GOYA).

Her second short film, her master's thesis, Close to September (2025), will premiere at the 75th Berlin Film Festival, in Berlinale Shorts. In the film, she explores fear of abandonment and dysfunction in romantic relationships through a love story that takes place in a camping resort in Costa Brava.
