



SYNOPSIS

On a rainy afternoon, Kavya (14) and Tara (10) idle away at their friend Revati's (14) house. With Revati's mother away, the afternoon stretches on as the three girls play hide-and-seek and later rummage through their friend's mother's dressing table, finding lipsticks and jewels - wanting to catapult themselves into womanhood.

When they begin rehearsing for a dance, the proximity of their bodies urges forth a sense of desire that they don't yet have words for.





ARTIST STATEMENT

This project draws its inspiration from my first memory of keeping a secret. On a hot Delhi afternoon, as I played 'house' with two friends, we became aware of a certain closeness to our bodies, a physical curiosity. We shared a look and in that moment, we were dangling somewhere between innocence and awareness. While all of us walked away knowing that this would remain a secret, what followed was a sense of shame.

It urged me to explore what desire looks like when it is pursued in hiding. By creating this film I am hoping for women to forgive their own memories of shame and know that they are not alone. I hope to see people talk about the messy moments in which they stumbled upon sexuality with compassion instead of guilt.



RHEA SHUKLA

Rhea Shukla is an Indian writer and director based between New York and India. Her work delves into themes of gender, sexuality, and identity. Rhea is driven by an enduring curiosity with people —the choices they make, the emotions that drive them, and the lasting memories that shape who they are. This fascination lies at the heart of her creative practice.

Currently pursuing her Masters of Fine Arts in Screenwriting and Directing from Columbia University in the City of New York, Rhea's collaborations include serving as a creative producer for Madhu, a narrative short film that premiered at Rotterdam and Lincoln Center's MoMA and won a Special Mention Jury Award at Palm Springs. She also directed I wanna be like you, a music video for Ora the molecule, which won the best music video at the Drunken Film Festival Oakland in 2023.

Presently Rhea is working on developing her first feature film Rafugiri (Darning)- a surreal narrative set in 1990's Delhi in which a mother's unfulfilled love from the past transcends space and time, finding new life through her daughter's present.
