

Director's statement

For me, Kiraparamia (Embera mythological character), represents a memory that would change everything. When I was seven years old, I witnessed a play performed by students from the Karmata Rúa indigenous community. I remember seeing a woman with her face painted blue and her hair covered with veiled stockings. This image would echo in my memory for years: She was crying, while people were laughing.

I asked my mother about the story I had just seen. She explained that Kiraparamia was a woman punished by nature for laughing at her husband, to which I asked her: Why punished and if on the contrary she was rewarded?

With this project I want to talk about childhood with a feminine approach, making evident different social problems that women face daily.


The audiovisual medium opens infinite doors to a universal language. I turn to this language because it is a space of freedom and construction, which has opened a possibility for me to believe and create.












Synopsis

Kari is an Emberá Chamí Indigenous girl who lives in fear of laughing.
Everything changes when she meets
Kera, a young woman who tells her the myth of Kiraparamia, a woman who, according to the elders, was punished by the gods for laughing at her

husband. However, Kera offers a new interpretation: Kiraparamia's laughter was what truly set her free. Inspired by this story, Kari decides to confront the kids who bully her by choosing her powerful laughter.
